



Camp Wild Oaks Summer Program Behavior Policies:

We take our campers' behavior very seriously during our summer programs. The nature of our activities may take campers out into nature, on field trips and into contact with activities that require a high level of concentration, understanding and safety regulation. In general, campers are expected to conduct themselves with respect and kindness, and to act safely and responsibly. Listening to directions is incredibly important during summer programs. Campers are learning new skills and therefore need to remember that our instructors are informing them of things they need to know; instructors need our campers' full attention.

If a camper exhibits disrespectful behavior that cannot be managed or redirected by group efforts on the part of the parents, Oak Hill School Staff, and Oak Hill Auxiliary Programs Staff, the camper may be asked to take a break from the program. If the behavior continues, their continuing attendance at camp will be evaluated between the instructor involved, the Auxiliary Programs/Camp Manager and The Head of School. The decision of the camper's future at camp will be at the discretion of those three individuals.

Any behavior that results in the harm of another camper or of an Auxiliary Programs/Camp Staff Member, will not be tolerated. At the first incident the camper will be asked to go home for the day. Parents will be consulted for a behavior plan to make sure the behavior does not continue.

If the behavior continues to cause harm to other campers, or staff, the camper may be asked to leave the program. If a camper is asked to leave the program because of harmful behavior, the family will not receive a refund.

Please understand that while we are aware that children of all ages are always learning social skills and how to interact with others, our top priority is the safety of all of our campers. While our staff wants to help all campers participate safely in our programs,

our staff is limited and removing a camper from a situation may be the best solution for all involved.
